

## WCN - The future



**Meals on Wheels Scheme in Wingham** We're trying to find out how many Wingham residents would be interested in Meals on Wheels being delivered to them from The Deal Centre for the Retired (Age UK) and also for drivers to deliver the meals from Deal at lunchtimes in their own cars. Drivers are recognised as volunteers but would be employed on a zero hours contract, paid the minimum wage, and a fuel allowance would be paid to them in recognition of their time and resources. The meals would be delivered in foil trays transported in heated, insulated boxes and are all freshly cooked on the premises and would cost £8.00 for a main course and pudding. Different dietary needs can be catered for and they are provided six days a week, excluding Saturday and can be opted into on different days as required. ## The Friends of St Mary's , Wingham

It was great seeing so many people from the village at our Harvest Supper and I hope that we might see more of you at our Lights of Love service on the 3rd November at 3 p.m., when we will remember those we have loved who have died. The following week we have the annual Remembrance Sunday service on the 12th November, which people will need to get to by about 10.30 a.m., if you are not taking part in the parade along the High Street beforehand.



St Mary's has been at the heart of the village for hundreds of years and whilst it might be more true to say that the pub or the village hall lay at the heart of the village now, it is still an important part of Wingham's life and certainly its history. The church dates from the 13th Century and is a Grade 1 listed building with an amazing history - if only stones could talk!!! It has withstood the test of time well but is now in need of some tender loving care in the form of some major building works.

Many people believe that the Church of England is rich - if only that were true. They also believe that the upkeep of church buildings comes from some magical central fund - if only that were true. Unfortunately, neither are true and the maintenance and upkeep are left completely to the members of the congregation. St Mary's is blessed with a loyal and faithful congregation but unfortunately it is small and mainly made up of retired people.

Whilst we can just find the money for everyday expenses, the cost of the now urgent building works that are required mainly to the roof and tower, are way beyond the means of that small group of people. We therefore intend to apply for grants and will try to raise sufficient money to match fund where necessary. The Friends of St Mary's do great work. They organise really enjoyable events and have raised quite a lot of money over the last few years and we are indebted and grateful to them.

However because of the scope of the work required we now need to look at raising additional funds. Don't worry. I'm not after your money - not yet anyway! I am after your experience, expertise and perhaps a little of your time. We really need help to identify appropriate funding bodies and to write bids for funding applications and to approach appropriate organisations and people for help.

As well as some advice and help in project managing the building work that needs to be done and some imaginative and new ways of raising additional money on top of what we are already doing and much more. 
